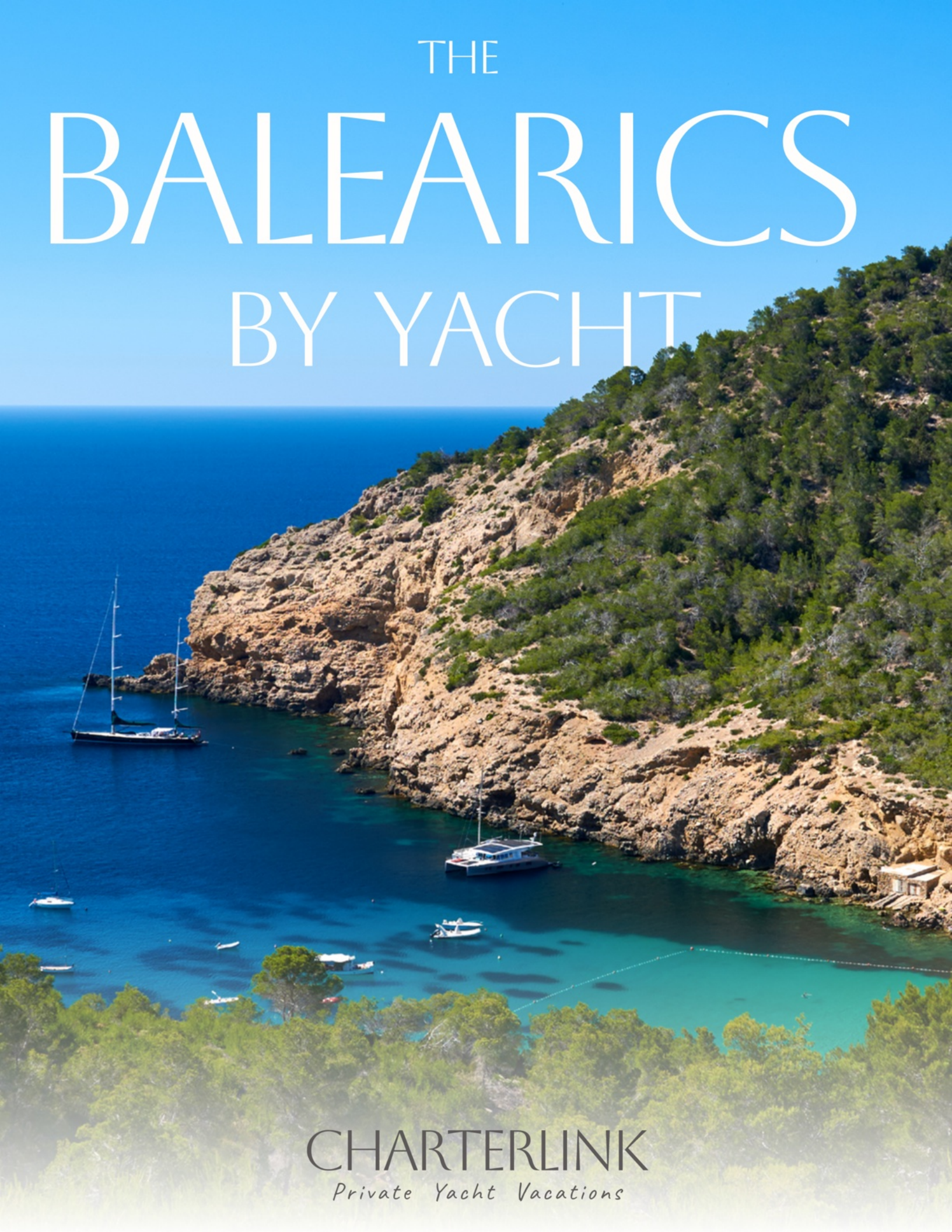

IBIZA & FORMENTERA

The Balearic Islands of Ibiza and Formentera offer one of the Mediterranean's most alluring yacht charter destinations. While Ibiza is famous for its nightlife, the island also reveals a serene, natural side with crystal waters, sleepy coves, pine-covered hills, and whitewashed villages. Formentera, its quieter sister island, is a laid-back paradise with turquoise seas and protected beaches. Starting and ending in Ibiza Town, this 7-night circular route includes stops at stunning beaches, charming villages, natural parks and of course, the glitz and glamor that the island is known for. The short daily sailing distances leave plenty of time for swimming, sunning, exploring on land; or simply doing nothing at all.

Ibiza's restaurant scene has evolved far beyond beach bars and tapas joints. Today, the island boasts a refined culinary identity that blends global sophistication with Mediterranean soul. From clifftop fine dining to chic countryside farm-to-table experiences, Ibiza attracts top chefs and discerning diners alike. The island's standout Michelin-starred restaurant is La Gaia by Óscar Molina, located in Ibiza Town and known for its artful fusion of Ibizan ingredients with Japanese technique. Another highlight is Es Tragon in San Antonio, also Michelin-starred, offering a creative tasting menu in a rustic-chic setting nestled among pine trees. Beyond the stars, celebrated restaurants such as Casa Maca, Nobu Ibiza Bay, Jul's, and Amante elevate local produce with international flair and luxurious settings. Ibiza is as much a destination for food lovers as it is for sun-seekers.

Ibiza's nightlife is famous for a reason, but it's not all about massive crowds and all-night raves. There's a more elegant side to the island's evening scene, where stylish beach clubs turn into candlelit lounges and top DJs play to more intimate, well-heeled crowds. Lío Ibiza, right on the marina, blends dinner, live performance, and late-night dancing in one glittering spot. Pacha remains a classic for a reason; glamorous, fun, and still attracting the world's best DJs. For something newer, Club Chinois brings a moody, luxurious feel to Ibiza Town's club scene, while Destino offers open-air parties with stunning views over the sea. Whether you're after cocktails and conversation or dancing under the stars, Ibiza's upmarket nightlife offers unforgettable evenings with just the right amount of sparkle.

Electricity: 230V, plugs type C and F

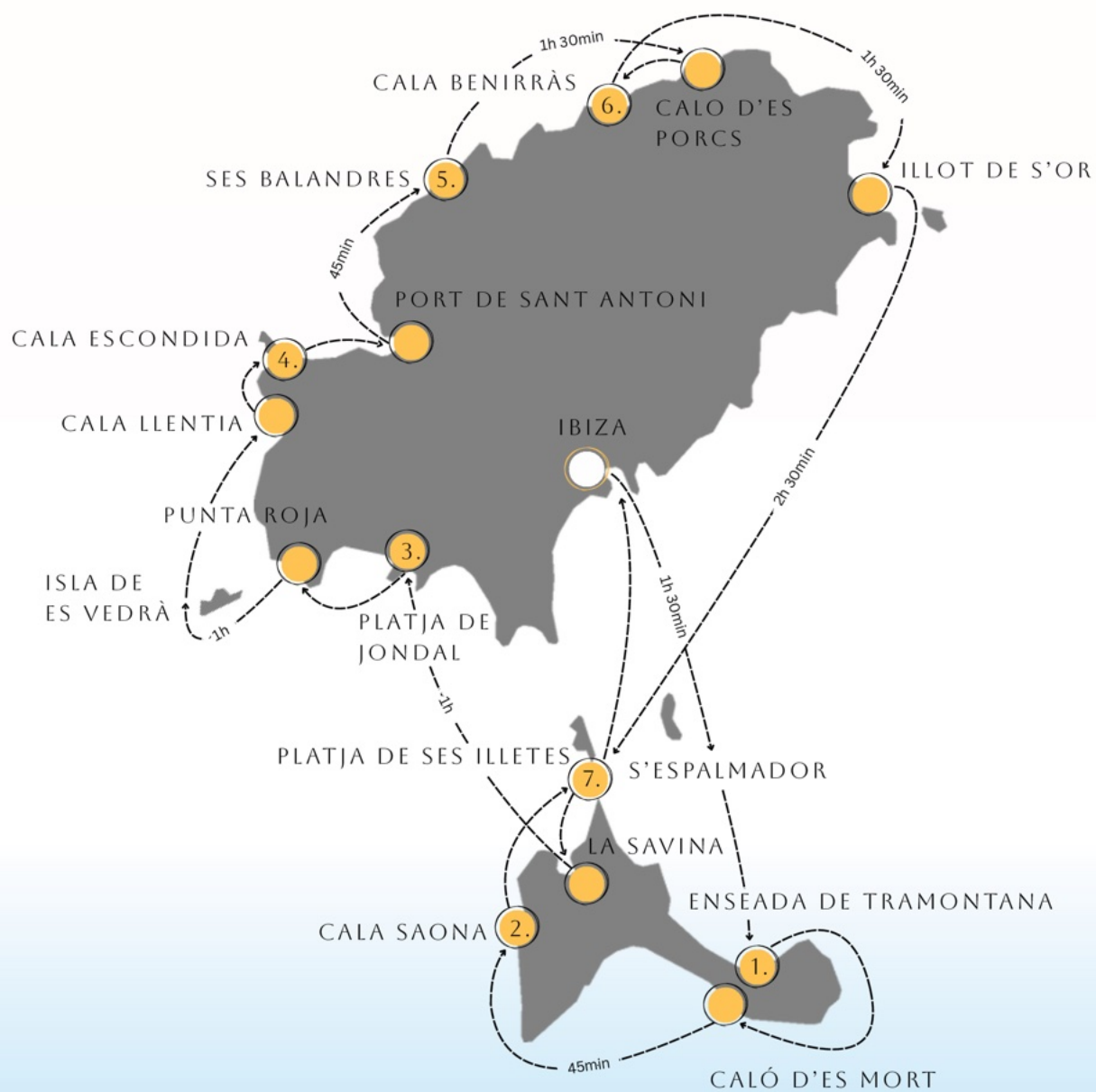

IBIZA TOWN

Ibiza Town is the island's soul, a mix of history, energy, and style. At the heart of it all is Dalt Vila, the walled old town that rises above the harbor. Wandering up its cobbled lanes feels like slipping into another time with whitewashed houses and flower-filled balconies, quiet courtyards, and the occasional glimpse of the sea. There are some lovely places to stay in and around the old town, from boutique hotels tucked inside centuries-old buildings to chic guesthouses with rooftop terraces. Spending a night in Ibiza Town before boarding your yacht is a great way to ease into your charter vacation.

During the day, there's plenty to see and enjoy. Climb to the top of old town for sweeping views of the marina and coastline, then linger in a shady square for coffee or a glass of wine. It's a place to explore slowly, without a plan. Browse the small shops for linen clothing, handmade jewelry, and local ceramics. Visit the contemporary art museum inside the old fortress walls, stop by the cathedral for more incredible views, or simply wander with a gelato in hand. In the afternoon, grab a seat at one of the café terraces along the pedestrian lanes, watch the street performers, and let Ibiza work its quiet charm before your charter even begins.

Down by the water, the mood shifts. The marina buzzes with life, lined with yachts, chic boutiques, and outdoor bars where the music is always playing. Stop for tapas in Plaza del Parque or settle into one of the waterfront restaurants and watch the world go by. Ibiza Town is never just one thing and starting your charter here is magic!





NIGHT 1

The morning of your charter begins with a relaxed breakfast in Ibiza Old Town or along the harbor. Think fresh pastries, strong coffee, and a breeze off the water setting the tone for the day. At midday, your yacht will be ready for boarding in the marina. You'll be greeted warmly by your crew, given a brief introduction, and made comfortable aboard. There's time to settle in, slip off your shoes, and take in the view before heading out to sea.

You'll set sail south to the island of Formentera. The next hour and a half of cruising gives you time to enjoy a cocktail, stretch out in the sun on deck, and let the breeze carry you closer to your first swim. No rush, no schedule, just heading out, leaving the main island behind.

Arrival to Ensenada de Tramontana, on the north coast of Formentera, where the yacht will anchor in this wide, sheltered bay with sandy seabeds and calm conditions. The water here is clear and inviting, perfect for a swim or a paddleboard session straight off the back of the yacht. Nearby, there's a small sea cave that's great for snorkeling. The shallow caverns in this area are lined with smooth rocks and schools of fish, making for fun underwater topography and a chance to explore Formentera's hidden corners.

As dusk falls, you'll stay anchored in the bay for the night. With no land-based lights to spoil the view, the sky here is spectacular; perfect for stargazing after a relaxing dinner on board. Choose to enjoy soft music, the sound of the ocean, and the scent of salt in the air to wind down your day, or turn up the volume and get the party started!





NIGHT 2

Wake up at your own pace and enjoy breakfast prepared by your private chef, before the yacht sets sail toward Caló des Mort, a small, tucked-away cove on the southern coast of Formentera. This intimate spot is framed by dramatic red rock cliffs and clear, shallow seabeds, making it an ideal anchorage away from the crowds. Its rugged beauty captures Formentera's natural charm perfectly.

Once anchored, take a short hike up the surrounding cliffs and enjoy sweeping views across the Mediterranean Sea. Consider launching the drone to capture a group photo with the striking contrast of the turquoise water against rust-colored rocks; it makes for a great vacation shot! After a delicious lunch aboard, choose to sunbathe on deck, dive in for a refreshing swim, or enjoy water sports launched straight from the yacht's aft platform. This bay is the perfect space to paddleboards, use the sea bobs or try out the e-foil.

Next, the yacht will head west around the headland to Cala Saona. Keep an eye out for the Cap de Barbaria Lighthouse, perched dramatically on the cliffs as you sail by on this 45 minute leg. Cala Saona is a livelier bay known for its horseshoe-shaped beach and backdrop of scraggly pines. The water here is also shallow and calm, perfect for floating in the sun and soaking up the island vibes. Head ashore for dinner at Restaurant Sol Post, well-known for serving some of the best paella on the island along with chilled cocktails and other seafood specialities. This is a place where the afternoon drifts easily into evening, music hums in the background, and conversation flows. Enjoy it! That's what you're here for.





NIGHT 3

The yacht departs this morning for an early sail north to Platja de Ses Illetes on the northern side of Formentera. This allows you to enjoy the area before the day boats arrive from Ibiza, loaded with tourists. Enjoy the rare privilege of strolling the famous sandbar in near solitude, and drift back to the yacht when you're ready for breakfast.

Enjoy a short sail south to the nearby port town of La Savina. Step ashore to browse charming boutique shops stacked with handmade jewellery, linen clothing, artisanal ceramics, and island souvenirs. Consider renting a scooter to explore more of the island of Formentera, with maps available to guide you to hidden coves and old watchtowers at your own pace.

Back aboard, your chef will prepare a leisurely lunch before the yacht sets sail north to the main island of Ibiza. After about an hour, you'll arrive in Platja des Jondal, nestled beneath hills scattered with pines and olive trees. This bay is a destination in its own right; a place to relax, unwind, or simply be seen.

Head ashore for a memorable dinner at Casa Jondal or Tropicana, some of Ibiza's trendiest beach club restaurants. The menus are seafood-focused and refined, with standout dishes like their fresh catch prepared to your taste and creative cocktails to match. After dinner, choose to return to the yacht or grab a taxi into Ibiza town to experience one of the island's iconic nightclubs. Dance until the early hours, or if you prefer a more subdued night, your captain can shift the yacht slightly around the corner to a peaceful anchorage beneath dramatic cliffs.





NIGHT 4

After breakfast, the yacht sails around the southwestern tip to Punta Roja, a secluded spot perfect for a morning of sunbathing, water sports, and a relaxed lunch on board. Your crew can set up paddleboards and towables behind the tender for you to enjoy, or alternatively lead you out on a snorkel along the nearby cliffs.

After lunch, the yacht will cruise past the breathtaking Isla de Es Vedrà, a dramatic limestone islet steeped in myth, rising from the sea in striking formation. There is no stop-off here, it's purely for sightseeing, offering an up-close view of this iconic natural landmark as you pass.

Next, continue north to Cala Llentia. This small cove is home to the Time and Space sculpture, thirteen basalt columns arranged in a semicircle like a modern-day Stonehenge, with a gold-tipped central pillar aligned with the winter solstice. Created by artist Andrew Rogers and commissioned by Guy Laliberté, it's a striking public artwork and a unique point of interest.

As sunset approaches, the yacht moves around the corner to Cala Escondida, next to the renowned Sunset Ashram Beach Club. You'll anchor here for the night and enjoy one of Ibiza's most cinematic golden hours. Let your crew prepare a beach setup for your own vibe, or head to the Sunset Ashram for drinks and internationally renowned DJs. Later, retreat to your yacht for a three-course dinner prepared by your chef and revel in a day that's all about soaking in the very best of a private yacht charter.





NIGHT 5

After breakfast, the yacht will sail around to Port de Sant Antoni, the island's second-largest town, docking at the nearby marina. From here, you'll enjoy a day exploring the central regions of Ibiza, with your first visit to Fluxà, the acclaimed Ibiza distillery and botanical garden. Here, you'll learn about traditional herbal liqueurs and see how botanicals such as fennel, lavender, thyme, and anise are incorporated into their signature herbaceous Hierbas Ibicencas. You'll stroll through the gardens, sample aromatic spirits, and gain a true sense of Ibiza's botanical heritage.

Next, the group will head to La Galeria Elefante, a hidden gem filled with beautiful clothing, home décor, ceramics, and artwork; perfect for finding something special to take home. Nearby, Can Kinoto and Alfareria Sa Teulera showcase handmade pottery and ceramics native to the island from their local workshops. The craftsmanship here speaks to Ibiza's enduring artisanal traditions.

Finish your day at Bodegas Can Rich de Buscastell, a local winery specializing in organic wines and olive oils. Enjoy a guided tasting of several wines and sample their extra virgin olive oils, paired with local cheeses, cured meats, fresh sourdough, and other Ibizan specialties; all with views across the vineyard.

Later in the afternoon, return to Port Sant Antoni to rejoin your yacht. From here, the captain will move around to Ses Balandres on Ibiza's north shore, where you'll spend your fifth evening anchored beneath dramatic cliffs, enjoying dinner aboard.



NIGHT 6

An early morning sail takes you to the breathtaking Cala des Porcs, about an hour and a half away. This secluded gem has limited anchorage, so an early arrival is vital to ensure your captain can get you the best spot. Once anchored, indulge in a late-morning brunch on the flybridge and settle in for a full day of sun and sea.

Cala des Porcs is the perfect playground for water lovers. Snorkel the nearby cliffs, float on inflatable mats, or paddleboard along the rocky shoreline. Get your heart rate up with a workout, or unwind with a chilled yoga session; either on deck or on a nearby paddleboard. This is a day to fully embrace life aboard your yacht, balancing fun, relaxation, and sun-soaked indulgence.

Your crew can host themed parties, bring out the games, and craft an entire day to celebrate you and your group. Embrace tropical energy or opt for chic Mediterranean vibes. Play games, sip cocktails, and let loose. Whether you're marking a birthday, anniversary, graduation or simply relishing time with loved ones; your crew can create a memorable celebration with thoughtful table settings, curated music, and plenty of enthusiasm.

Just before sunset, you'll sail a short distance to Cala Benirrás, a peaceful cove perfect for unwinding after the day's festivities; or for turning the music up and carrying on with the fun! Anchor beneath this stunning natural backdrop and enjoy a gourmet dinner prepared by your chef. How the evening proceeds is up to you!





NIGHT 7

Enjoy this morning with a leisurely coffee on the flybridge, taking in the peaceful scenery of Cala Benirrás and the horizon stretching out toward the Spanish mainland . After breakfast, the yacht will begin the 1.5 hour sail around to Illot de s'Or, a quiet islet that provides the perfect stop to break up the passage along Ibiza's windward eastern coast.

Here, you'll enjoy a restorative swim in the clear waters followed by lunch on board. Take a final dip, stretch out on the floating pads, and soak up the sun before continuing your journey southwest. The 2.5 hour sail brings you to Espalmador and the Platja de Ses Illetes that you first visited on Day 3; a perfect final anchorage for your last night aboard.

You'll arrive just as the last of the day boats head home, leaving you in one of the Balearic's most magical settings. The sun will set directly over Isla de Es Vedrà, the dramatic landmark you sailed past earlier in the week, now perfectly framed on the horizon. As the light fades, the sandbars glow golden. Step ashore one last time for a barefoot stroll or a group photo shoot and take it all in.

Your final evening aboard is yours to savor. Dine alfresco beneath the stars, share memories from the past week, and raise a glass to the unforgettable journey. The following morning, the yacht will return to Ibiza Town, where your charter will come to an end and your crew will see you safely departed. Come back soon!

Consider flying via Palma Mallorca on your way home and spending a night or two exploring.
